erek and his wife were away celebrating their 25th wedding anniversary when he suddenly felt unwell... They called a doctor who noticed he had a huge swelling on his abdomen.

Derek hadn't noticed any symptoms. Maybe a bit of reflux. But suddenly, he was in A&E with doctors asking him questions and running tests.

Their verdict: stage 4 liver and bowel cancer. He needed emergency surgery to put a colostomy in place.
